Director Zulauf opened the meeting of Group 1 to review the 2019 Regulatory Agenda. Each working group member introduced themselves. These stakeholder meetings will be recorded and the audio posted on the Auto Industry Division website.

# **Working Group Meeting Scope – Topics and Discussion**

- Review drafts of proposed revisions to rules;
- Determine if a second Group meeting is needed.

Director Zulauf explained the rulemaking process, which consists of reviewing the rules and discussing input written and verbal provided by stakeholders and the Division's subject matter experts.

Mr. Bebee commented that this regulatory compilation provides an initial framework for Stakeholders to discuss each listed regulation in the course of the Stakeholder meetings. The regulations appear as a solitary or in rule groupings to ensure concurrent consideration of parallel regulations respective to Motor Vehicles and Powersports Vehicles.

The 2019 Rule Group 1 compilation of regulation comments are as follows:

Regulation 44-20-121(3)(a) & Regulation 44-20-121(6)(a)12-6-104(3)(o) - The Division's proposed recommendations were reviewed.

Mr. Dommermuth, Esq – CADA suggested change of verbiage to sub-paragraph (d) throughout. The current version grants the Motor Vehicle Dealer Board broader discretion when reviewing applications.

Regulation 44-20-420(3)(a) & Regulation 44-20-420(5)(a) - Mr. Dommermuth suggests changes to paragraph 1 sub-section (c).

After a lengthy discussion, all concurred with change to language recommendations made by Mr. Jones.

**Regulation 44-20-404(1)(1)** - Mr. Bebee stated that he has spoken with Jerry Abboud, Executive Director of the Powersports Association of Colorado and he agrees with the Division's proposed recommendations.

After discussion, all concurred with proposed recommendation.

Regulation 44-20-108(1)(b) & Regulation 44-20-408(1)(b) - After a lengthy discussion, all parties concur with the recommended revisions to the language.

Group took a 15 min. break - Reconvened at 3:26 p.m.

#### Regulation 44-20-121(3)(c) & Regulation 44-20-121(6)(h)

Mr. Jones stated that rules 44-21-21 and 44-21-21(3)(c) would be combined to make a single regulation so that rules will apply to all licenses issued by the Motor Vehicle Dealer Board.

After a lengthy discussion, there was a collective recommendation to make additions to verbiage in paragraph 2. All parties concurred.

### Regulation 44-20-420(3)(c) & Regulation 44-20-420(6)(h)

All parties concur with the recommended revision to Powersports parallel rule.

**Regulation 44-20-121(6)(f) & Regulation 44-20-420(5)(f) -** The Division recommends merging these rules into two other existing rules to achieve a more comprehensive set of rules that will track procedures already in use and clarify responsibilities.

The collective working group concurred with the recommendation for motor vehicle and powersports rules respectively.

A consensus was reached by all parties to move forward with recommended revisions by close of business Friday, September 6, 2019.

Director Zulauf stated that once revisions are made and all public comments received, the formal notice to the Secretary of State's office will be made and a Rulemaking Hearing scheduled for October 15, 2019 at 1:00 p.m.

Public Comment - Mr. Perkins stated that it has been an honor and privilege to work with Mr. Zulauf and he appreciated his tutelage through the years.

Mr. Dommermuth expressed his gratitude for Mr. Zulauf's tremendous leadership.

Director Zulauf thanked everyone for their participation and adjourned the meeting at 4:40 p.m.
