Dear Liquor Industry Members, Local Clerks, and Stakeholders:

The Liquor Enforcement Division (LED) is commencing its yearly rule making process for rules to be effective January 1, 2019. The LED is going to convene a Liquor Rules Working Group (LRWG) to consider rules from the following categories:

- 1. Changes or additions to statutes.
- 2. Changes to regulations within the regulatory agenda (which are regulations <u>47-1010 through 47-306</u>, 1 C.C.R. 203-2).
- 3. Trade practices.
- 4. Additions/changes from the LED and industry input.

The first meeting of the LRWG will be held on Monday, May 21, 2018 at 1 p.m. at:

The schedule for subsequent meeting will be established at the first meeting. If you want to submit a rule change/addition, you must submit your request using form DR2477, which is attached and also found on our website, www.colorado.gov/enforcement/liquor.

However, non-LRWG members can actively participate in subgroups and provide input during each LRWG meeting. The deadline for requesting to be a member of the LRWG is Friday, May 11, 2018. Those selected will be notified by May 16, 2018.

If you have other issues you want to address during the LRWG, there will be an opportunity to include those issues during your registration process. The first meeting will focus on evaluating and prioritizing issues the Division has identified and issues submitted by the liquor industry and assigning specific issues to subgroups. The deadline for submitting issues is May 11, 2018.
