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SEPTEMBER 1, 1994

The Division of Gaming is establishing a panel of division staff and industry representatives to review and recommend suggested changes to the Internal Control Minimum Procedures.

The review panel will consist of investigators and auditors from the Division of Gaming and three industry representatives (one from each city). The industry representatives we be selected through a nomination and election process. The Division's Audit Section is accepting nominations for potential industry representatives until **Friday**, **September 16**, **1994**. Ballots will then be mailed to each licensed casino to select a representative for the casino's respective city. All ballots must be received at by the Audit Section by **Friday**, **September 30**, **1994**.

Nominees should have a good working knowledge of the internal control minimum procedures. The revision process is expected to last approximately six months, with the panel convening every two weeks for four hours. The time commitment for industry panel members will include additional time spent with city committees discussing any changes that should be submitted to the panel. In other words, the industry panel member should be a "city" advocate, possibly holding additional meetings with city committees to screen and review suggested revisions before taking the suggestions to the panel. The first meeting will take place sometime in October at a central location, with subsequent meetings rotated between cities.
