Describe the Recommendation: Require the Colorado Liquor Enforcement Division to provide the Joint House and Senate Business Committees annually, through the SMART Act (HB 13-1299) Hearings, an historical briefing of the three tiered system of alcohol distribution, and the importance of protecting and promoting the system from all three tier's (manufacturing, distributing, retail). In keeping with legislature's directives, the Liquor Enforcement Division shall review and publish its assessments as to whether any proposed changes to CRS 12-46 and 12-47 and Colorado Liquor Rules 1 C.C.R 203-2 promote and protect the three tier system, or contradict the system.
- 3. Which portion or portions of Senate Bill 16-197 does this recommendation address (underline all those that apply)?
