# Colorado Liquor Enforcement Division SB16-197 STATUTORY (Sub-Groups) Minutes of the Meetings

Meeting of October 13, 2016 8:00a – 3:00p Department of Ag. 305 Interlocken Pkwy. Broomfield, CO

## Welcome & Introductions (& Announcements)

Director Maroney opened the meeting and began by thanking everyone for coming.

We are to have our Recommendations & Findings to the Legislature by January, 2018. Also please make note that the Liquor Rule Making Hearing is scheduled on October 31, 2016 to start at 1:00pm at 1881 Pierce Street, Room 110.

## 3.2 % Beer Sub-group: (Chairman – Patrick Maroney)

#### Purpose

Develop an implementation process for grocery & convenience stores to apply for a license to sell malt liquor and fermented malt beverages containing at least one-half percent alcohol by volume starting January 1, 2019.

Analyze the impact that removed the alcohol content limit on fermented malt beverages will have on the alcohol beverage industry as a whole, as well as on current retail licensees.

#### Discussion

- Is this as simple as changing the 3.2% definition? There was much discussion about having an actual application process or just allowing conversions. There were several different thoughts on this subject.
- Do we combine Article 46 & 47 or do we make changes to Article 46?
- How will this affect Retail Liquor Sores and the 1,500 | 3,000 requirements? Currently, 3.2 beer licenses would not be subject to the distance limitation.
- Do we create a new business type?
  - » Will current 3.2 licensees have to reapply or will they automatically be re-issued under the new license type.
  - » Re-do neighborhood Needs & Desires?
  - » What if within 500 feet of schools?
  - » Grandfathered or not?
- What about 3.2 beer in Parks? Possibly changing laws to allow public consumption with parameters.
- What are the Public Safety issues caused by this? Public consumption and/or proximity to schools?
- Will each License Type be willing to give up a little to meet a consensus?
- Do we get rid of 3.2 on/off license type?
- Is it this group's goal to allow those who currently have a 3.2 License to keep a license (in some form or fashion to be able to still sell beer) come January, 2019? Majority agreed.

#### **Next Meeting**

- Need hard statistics from Liquor Enforcement. How many 3.2, Retail Liquor Stores & Liquor Licensed Drug Stores are there?
- CML to ask Locals what they may require with regard to local ordinances.

<u>3 Tier Subgroup</u>: (Chairman – Ron Kammerzell)

#### **Purpose**

Shall consider other legislative, regulatory, or administrative changes necessary to promote the three-tiered distribution system in Colorado.

#### Discussion

- Education and Outreach to Strengthen 3-Tier process
- Trade Practice Enforcement
  - » Give LED Teeth (Allow higher fines for violations)
  - » More staff for trade practice investigations
- Other states are being challenged on 3-Tier process.
- Add 3-Tier support statement to Statute like the Division of Gaming.
- Protect & Preserve 3-Tier (do not let get eroded)

## <u>Tastings & Growlers Subgroup</u>: (Chairman – Patrick Maroney – for Lewis Koski)

## **Purpose**

Examine and make recommendations regarding laws governing tastings conducted on retail premises licensed under Article 47 of this Title and the ability of retail liquor stores licensed under Section 12-47-407 to sell growlers containing malt liquors.

## Discussion | Tastings

- What is the difference between Tastings & Samplings?
- Do we increase the number of days allowed for Tastings?
- Who can pour?
  - » Value of Labor
- Wineries can charge for tastings... Retail Liquor Stores cannot.
- Pour out leftover alcohol (what if another tasting next day)?
  - » We can lock up?
  - » Would this violate open container law in Retail Liquor Stores?
- With Blue Law change... can we have Tastings on Sundays now?
- Pour amounts allowed
- Key issues (from RLS):
  - Sunday tastings
  - o # of tastings per year
  - Amount allowed to pour
  - o Problems with having to discard any remaining product
  - Who gets to pour why not suppliers/wholesalers
  - o Who can pay for the product retailers v. wholesalers
  - o RLS would like to have educational classes to promote products

# Discussion | Growlers

- Allow refills at Retail Liquor Stores?
- Breweries sell container. Will only refill their container.
- Will this pertain to Retail Liquor Stores only?
- Health & Safety of Public
  - » How maintain quality of product?
  - » Inspected by Health Department?
  - » What if growler brought back unsanitary?
  - » Allow only employees to fill?
  - » Requirements to keep out of reach of customers (maintain sanitary conditions).

- Determine cost (offered below laid in).
- Manufacturers' ability to opt out.
- Retailer to pay for refill stations. What about leases from wholesalers?
- Key issues (from RLS):
  - Should RLS be allowed to refill/sell growlers?
  - o Does a food service license apply?
  - o Should the brewer need to opt in?
  - Purchasing and leasing of equipment
  - o Who fills the growler? Employee or customer
  - o Quality of product?
  - Who cleans the lines used to fill growlers
- There was a lot of discussion whether or not the working group could recommend other license types to be able to sell/refill growlers. Both Mr. Kammerzell and Mr. Maroney pointed out the wording from SB16-197 said for the working group to make recommendations for RLS to sell growlers. If others want that ability, this information will be a part of the report but the recommendation can only include what SB16-197 states. Others in the room felt SB16-197 does give a broader perspective.

- Bring list of bullet points you believe are issues.
- Present any rules from FDA regarding Growlers.
- Many states currently doing. Get their guidelines. What were their issues?
