Re: August 2025 Gaming Fund Financial Statement Presentation

Following are highlights from the Gaming Fund financial statements ending August 31, 2025.

Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance

Gaming tax revenues have increased by \$2,263,060 or 12% over last year. Total Revenues for the Limited Gaming Fund as of August 31 were \$20,967,349, a 7.5% increase compared to August 2024.

Total expenditures for the period ending August 2025 were approximately \$3.4 million. This represents a 9.5% increase over last year. The main reason for the increase is in the Salaries and Benefits, which increased by \$167,332 or 9.9% over last year. There was a 5.7% increase in the average of health, dental and life expenditures this fiscal year and we had 10 more employees in August of this year compared to last year. The PERA Direct Distribution expenditure is \$10,353 more this fiscal year compared to last fiscal year. The Colorado State Patrol expenditure increased \$126,181 or 20% over August of last year.

The excess of total revenues over expenditures was \$17,608,670. This is a 7% increase over last year and represents the amount we could distribute as of August 31.

Next, as you are aware from my cover letter, we are only required to prepare a Statement of Revenues and Expenditures. For those of you who were here last year, you may recall that since the inception of the statewide financial system known as CORE, the State now takes a long time to close the fiscal year. Beginning balances do not roll into the next fiscal year until the State closes the previous fiscal year. Therefore, we will not be able to prepare a balance sheet until the State closes. Regarding the budget, we should be able to prepare this statement with September's financial statements.

Following are highlights from the Sports Betting Fund financial statements ending August 31, 2025.

Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance

Current fiscal year Sports Betting Tax revenue was \$6,420,663, which is an increase of \$1,675,490, or about 35%, over the prior fiscal year. Total Sports Betting Fund revenues through August 2025 increased by \$1,273,278 or 19% over August 2024.

Total Sports Betting Fund expenditures through August 2025 were \$712,435. This is an increase of about 2% over August 2024. The excess of total revenues over expenditures was \$1,258,181. This is a 21% increase compared to August of 2024

International Game Technologies Inc (IGT) has submitted a request for approval by the Colorado Limited Gaming Control Commission to offer a multi-state multi-link wide-area progressive link. The link is called Ultra Link, and the games are Wheel of Fortune-Cash Link Reels-Double Gold and Wheel of Fortune-Cash Link Reels-Double Diamond. Colorado Regulation 30-1244.30 Multi-State Multi-Link/Wide Area Progressive (MSWAP) Systems (Rule 30-1244.30) allows multi-state progressive systems to be offered in Colorado upon successful completion of testing and receiving approval by the Colorado Limited Gaming Control Commission as outlined in Rule 30-1244.30. Colorado casinos will be joining a multi-state multi-link wide-area progressive system with Nevada, South Dakota and New Jersey casinos. These casinos are linked to IGT's central site in Nevada. Other jurisdictions may also join this IGT Progressive System in the future.

About the Systems

The "Ultra Link" link will be active at The Lodge Casino Inc. on 3 Slot Machines and will offer two games "Wheel of Fortune Cash Link Reels Double Gold and Wheel of Fortune Cash Link Reels Double Diamond"

"Wheel of Fortune Cash Link Reels Double Gold"

The Wheel of Fortune Cash Link Reels Double Gold game is a 3-reel, 9-line MEGAJACKPOTS mechanical reel game with 3 progressive levels. The "Spin" symbol appears on reel 3 only. The "Red Seven", "Purple Seven", "Orange Seven, "Five Bar" and the "Single Bar" symbols may appear with

"Double" sub-symbol. Symbols containing "Double" sub-symbol substitute for their respective symbols without "Double". Each "Double" sub-symbol that substitutes in a line win multiplies the pay for that win by 2x, except the "Red Seven", "Red Seven Double", "Red Seven Double" symbols. More than 1 multiplier may substitute and multiply in a line win up to 8x.

Different reels are used for each bet multiplier. Line wins must appear in active positions on played lines. Only the highest win is paid on each line. Line wins are multiplied by the bet multiplier. Wins on different played lines are added. Increasing the bet multiplier increases the number of active pointers in the 'Wheel Bonus' and increases the chances of winning the 'Cash Link Feature', the 'Wheel Bonus' and the Major and Minor jackpots.

'Wheel Bonus'

The "Coin" symbol in any active position on reels 1 and 2 and the "Spin" symbol in any position on reel 3 awards the 'Wheel Bonus'. The 'Wheel Bonus' is played after the 'Cash Link Feature'. Win 1 wheel spin. A number of wheel pointers corresponding to the bet multiplier from the awarding game are activated. Touch 'Touch To Spin' to spin the wheel. After the wheel stops, win the award indicated by each active wheel pointer.

If an active wheel pointer indicates Cash Link 10x Wedge, Cash Link 7x Wedge, or Cash Link 5x Wedge, win the value in the Cash Link meter multiplied by 10x, 7x, or 5x, respectively. If more than 1 active wheel pointer indicates a multiplier, win the value in the Cash Link meter multiplied by the sum of the indicated multipliers. If Cash Link 10x Wedge, Cash Link 7x Wedge, or Cash Link 5x Wedge is not indicated by an active wheel pointer, win the value in the Cash Link meter. The total bonus win is awarded and the 'Wheel Bonus' ends. A different wheel is used for each bet multiplier.

'Cash Link Feature'

The "Coin" symbol in any active position on reels 1 and 2 and "Spin" symbol, "Coin" symbol in any active position on reel 3 awards the 'Cash Link Feature'. When playing a bet multiplier of 1x or 2x, each "Coin" symbol in an active position on the reels appears with a credit value. When playing a bet multiplier of 3x, 4x or 5x, each "Coin" symbol in an active position on the reels appears with a credit value. The credit value displayed on each "Coin" symbol appearing in an active position on the reels is added to the Cash Link meter. If the 'Wheel Bonus' is awarded in the same base game as the 'Cash Link Feature', the value in the Cash Link meter persists into the 'Wheel Bonus'. If the 'Wheel Bonu's is not awarded in the same base game as the 'Cash Link Feature', the value in the Cash Link meter is awarded and the 'Cash Link Feature' ends. (refer to the description section of GLI letter MO-73-IGT-24-93)

"Wheel of Fortune Cash Link Reels Double Diamond"

The "Wheel of Fortune Cash Link Reels Double Diamond" is a 3-reel, 9-line mechanical reel game with three progressive levels. The "Spin" symbol appears on reel 3 only. The "Double Diamond" symbol matches all symbols except the "Double Diamond", "Spin", and "Coin" symbols. Win combinations using a symbol match must contain at least one symbol other than the "Double Diamond" symbol. Each "Double Diamond" symbol that matches in a line win multiplies the pay for that win by 2x. More than 1 multiplier may match and multiply in a win, up to 4x. Different reels are used for each bet multiplier. Line wins must appear in active positions on played lines. Only the highest win is paid on each line. Line wins are multiplied by the bet multiplier. Wins on different played lines are added.

'Cash Link Feature'

The "Coin" symbol in any active position on reels 1 and 2 and the "Spin" or "Coin" symbols in any active position on reel 3 awards the 'Cash Link Feature'. When playing a bet multiplier of 1x or 2x, each "Coin" symbol in an active position on the reels appears with a credit value. When playing a bet multiplier of 3x, 4x or 5x, each "Coin" symbol in an active position on the reels appears with a credit value. The credit value displayed on each "Coin" symbol appearing in an active position on the reels is added to the Cash Link meter. If the 'Wheel Bonus' is awarded in the same base game as the 'Cash Link Feature', the value in the Cash Link meter is awarded and the 'Cash Link Feature' ends.

'Wheel Bonus'

The "Coin" symbol in any active position on reels 1 and 2 and the "Spin" symbol in any active position on reel 3 awards the 'Wheel Bonus'. The 'Wheel Bonus' is played after the 'Cash Link Feature'. Win 1 wheel spin. A number of wheel pointers equal to the bet multiplier from the awarding game are activated. TOUCH TO SPIN to spin the wheel. After the wheel stops, the player wins the award indicated by each active wheel pointer. If the GRAND wedge is awarded when playing a bet level of \$5.00 or more, the player wins the Grand Jackpot. If the GRAND wedge is awarded when playing a bet level of less than \$5.00, the player wins a credit value.

If an active wheel pointer indicates 10x, 7x, or 5x, the player wins the value in the Cash Link meter multiplied by 10x, 7x, or 5x, respectively. If more than 1 active wheel pointer indicates a multiplier, the player wins the value in the Cash Link meter multiplied by the sum of the indicated multipliers. If 10x, 7x, or 5x is not indicated by an active wheel pointer, the player wins the value in the Cash Link meter. The total bonus win is awarded and the 'Wheel Bonus' ends. A different wheel is used for each bet multiplier. (refer to the description section of GLI letter MO-73-IGT-24-98)

The primary progressive award begins at \$ 1,125,000 with the odds of winning at 1 in 49,999,999. The primary progressive award is paid in periodic installments or lump sum in accordance with Rule 30-1244.30.

The game has been approved by Gaming Laboratories, Inc. (GLI) based on Colorado rules and regulations. The Cash Link Reels link is configured with the top level as a grand prize progressive award with a reset amount of \$1,125,000. There is only a primary award, there are no secondary awards.

Adjusted Gross Proceeds

In calculating adjusted gross proceeds for Colorado, participating retail licensees have the sole responsibility to pay all revenue generated and game jackpots awarded except the MSP progressive amount in accordance with Colorado Regulation 30-1603 Adjusted gross proceeds computations.

If the statewide and multi-state multi-link system offers a secondary jackpot that is reimbursed by the system vendor, the following applies. When licensees pay out secondary jackpots, 100% of the amount paid to the patron is not deducted to arrive at taxable AGP on the gaming tax return. The prorated portion

of the secondary jackpot is the amount allowed as a deduction on the gaming tax return to arrive at taxable AGP in accordance with ICMP Section 11 Accounting (O).

When the MSP Progressive is awarded the retail licensees deduct its pro-rata contribution in the month in which the MSP Progressive is awarded in accordance with Rule 30-1244.30(1)(m). IGT provides each participating retail licensee with its pro-rata contribution amount listed on its Progressive Jackpot Contribution Report. IGT also provides the same report to the Division with all participating retail licensees and their pro-rate contribution amount. This report is used by the Division to support the retail licensee's deduction on the gaming tax return.

Testing Requirements

Rule 30-1244.30 allows a licensee to offer multi-state multi-link wide area progressive system upon successfully passing Phase I and Phase II testing and receiving the Commission's approval.

Phase I testing is conducted by Gaming Laboratories International (GLI) and includes the testing of the gaming devices and communication hardware. The IGT gaming devices and communication hardware successfully passed the Phase I testing.

Phase II testing is conducted jointly with IGT, GLI and the Division. This Phase includes a field inspection at the central site, located in Reno, Nevada, and testing of the system including three gaming machines at The Lodge casino (Wheel of Fortune game). The IGT Ultra Link MSP successfully passed the Phase II testing.

Recommendation

Based upon the Division's review of the results for Phase I and Phase II testing, the Division recommends the approval of the IGT Ultra Link interstate WAP link for use in Colorado. The Division will continue to monitor the IGT multi-jurisdictional progressive system, and the various reports submitted by IGT during the field trial to ensure the system is operating in accordance with the gaming rules and regulations.

Upon approval by the Commission at the October 16, 2025, Commission meeting, IGT will begin the system field trial. Upon successful completion the Division will release IGT from the field trial.

Re: Proposed Rule Changes - Summary

On October 16, 2025, I will be presenting two Rule changes to the Commission on behalf of the Division of Gaming. The proposed changes will affect Gaming Rule 8, Rules for Blackjack, and Gaming Rule 23, Rules for Craps.

The first rule I will be presenting is 30-899.30 Double Down Madness, which is a Blackjack variation game owned by Light and Wonder Gaming (LnW) of Las Vegas, Nevada. Double Down Madness was submitted in February 2025. There was a last minute change made to the rule. In section 10, pay table 3, there was only supposed to be one pay out, "Dealer 22". The other 2 pay outs, "Dealer Colored 22" and "Dealer 22", were taken out by Light and Wonder.

Double Down Madness completed a successful 70 day field trial at the Lodge Casino in Black Hawk starting April 9, 2025 and ending June 25, 2025. During the field trial at the Lodge, Double Down Madness had a final hold of approximately 17%. There were no issues or negative comments about the game. The Lodge Casino is planning on keeping the game on the floor. Double Down Madness is being played in Iowa, Michigan, Nevada, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Washington State, Washington Tribal and Ontario Canada.

The Table Games Committee has reviewed the rules of the game, and it is compliant with Rule 8. The Table Games Committee, Light and Wonder Gaming and the Lodge Casino all recommend the approval of Double Down Madness, so it can be played in Colorado.

The next rule I am presenting is 30-2399.08 Lucky Roller, which is a side wager for Stadium Craps. Lucky Roller is owned by Interblock USA L.C., of Las Vegas, Nevada.

Lucky Roller completed a successful 145 day field trial at the Lodge Casino in Black Hawk starting February 28, 2025 and ending July 23, 2025. During the field trial, Lucky Roller had a final hold of approximately 4.64%. There were no issues or negative comments about the game. The Lodge Casino is planning on keeping the game on the floor. Lucky Roller is being played in 14 other jurisdictions both inside and outside the United States.

The Table Games Committee has reviewed the rules of the game, and it is compliant with Rule 23. The Table Games Committee, Interblock USA L.C., and the Lodge Casino all recommend the approval of Lucky Roller, so it can be played in Colorado.

BASIS AND PURPOSE FOR RULE 8

The purpose of Rule 8 is to establish playing rules for blackjack and procedures for conducting blackjack games in compliance with section 44-30-302 (2). The statutory basis for Rule 8 is found in sections 44-30-201, C.R.S., 44-30-203, C.R.S., 44-30-302, C.R.S., 44-30-816, C.R.S., and 44-30-818, C.R.S.

RULE 8 RULES FOR BLACKJACK

30-899.30 The Play – Double Down Madness.

DOUBLE DOWN MADNESS IS A BLACKJACK VARIATION GAME, THE RIGHTS TO WHICH ARE OWNED BY LNW GAMING, INC OF LAS VEGAS, NV AND WHICH MAY BE TRANSFERRED OR ASSIGNED.

DOUBLE DOWN MADNESS SHALL BE PLAYED ON TABLES DISPLAYING THE DOUBLE DOWN MADNESS LAYOUT ONLY, BUT MAY INCLUDE OTHER APPROVED LNW GAMING, INC PRODUCTS WITH THE DIVISIONS APPROVAL.

- (1) DOUBLE DOWN MADNESS IS A VARIANT OF BLACKJACK, (6) OR EIGHT (8) STANDARD DECKS CONSISTING OF STANDARD 52-CARD DECKS WILL BE USED.
- (2) EACH PLAYER WILL MAKE AN INITIAL BET IN THE AMOUNT SPECIFIED AT THE TABLE BY THE RETAIL LICENSEE AND MAY PLACE OPTIONAL OR MANDATORY PROGRESSIVE PUSH 22 WAGER BASED ON THE OPERATOR'S DISCRETION. (PER HOUSE POLICY)
- THE PLAYER RECEIVES A SINGLE FACE-UP CARD AND THE DEALER RECEIVES A FACE-UP CARD AND A FACE-DOWN CARD. BEFORE THE PLAYER TAKES ANY ACTION, THE DEALER PEEKS FOR A BLACKJACK WHEN THEY HAVE AN ACE, TEN, JACK, QUEEN, OR KING AS THE UP-CARD. IF THEY HAVE A BLACKJACK, THE GAME IMMEDIATELY ENDS AND THE MAIN WAGER IS LOST, REGARDLESS OF THE PLAYER'S CARD. OTHERWISE, THE PLAYER CHOOSES TO HIT, STAND, OR DOUBLE DOWN.
- (4) THE PROGRESSIVE WAGER FOCUSES SOLELY ON THE DEALER'S HAND, IF THE DEALER'S FINAL HAND DOESN'T RESULT IN A BUST OR EXCEEDS 22, THE PROGRESSIVE BET RESULTS IN A LOSS.
- (5) DOUBLE DOWN MADNESS FOLLOWS THE BASIC BLACKJACK RULES AND EXCEPTIONS AS FOLLOWS:
 - (A) HIT: THE PLAYER RECEIVES AN ADDITIONAL CARD
 - (B) STAND: THE PLAYER INDICATED THEIR ACTIONS ARE COMPLETE
 - (C) DOUBLE DOWN: THE PLAYER PLACES AN ADDITIONAL WAGER OF VALUE LESS THAN OR EQUAL TO THEIR CURRENT WAGER AMOUNT. NOTE THAT THE PLAYER CAN CONTINUE TAKING ACTIONS AFTER DOUBLING DOWN. THE PLAYER CAN DOUBLE DOWN EVEN WITH THREE OR MORE CARDS. THE ONLY EXCEPTION IS IF THEY DOUBLE DOWN WITH A SINGLE ACE IN WHICH THE PLAYER IS DEALT A SINGLE-CARD AND IS FORCED TO STAND
 - (D) NOTE THAT SURRENDERING AND SPLITTING ARE NOT AVAILABLE
- THE PLAYER REPEATEDLY CHOOSES FROM THE ACTIONS ABOVE UNTIL THEY CHOOSE TO STAND, OR THEIR HAND BUSTS WITH A SCORE OF OVER 21. IF THE PLAYER BUSTS, THEY LOSE THEIR MAIN WAGER AND ANY ADDITIONAL WAGERS MADE FROM DOUBLING DOWN. IF THE PLAYER HAS A BLACKJACK, FROM HITTING OR DOUBLING DOWN, THEY IMMEDIATELY WIN.
- (7) THE DEALER THEN REVEALS THEIR FACE-DOWN CARD. THE DEALER HITS UNTIL THEIR HARD-TOTAL IS 17 OR HIGHER; DEALER HITS ON SOFT-17. IF THE DEALER ENDS UP WITH A TOTAL OF 22 POINTS, THEN ALL NON-BUSTED WAGERS PUSH. OTHERWISE, THE DEALER AND PLAYER HANDS ARE COMPARED AS IN CONVENTIONAL BLACKJACK.

- (8) INSURANCE- IF THE DEALER'S UP-CARD IS AN ACE, AN INSURANCE WAGER IS OFFERED TO THE PLAYER AT HALF OF THE AMOUNT OF THE MAIN WAGER. THE DEALER PROCEEDS TO PEEK AT THEIR FACE-DOWN CARD TO CHECK FOR A BLACKJACK. IF SO, THE INSURANCE WAGER WINS 2 TO 1. OTHERWISE, THE INSURANCE WAGER IS LOST. NOTE-NO EVEN MONEY IS ALLOWED
- (9) THE PUSH 22 SIDE WAGER WINS IF THE DEALER ENDS WITH A TOTAL OF 22. IF THE PLAYER BUSTS OR OBTAINS A BLACKJACK, THE DEALER WILL STILL DRAW CARDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF RESOLVING THE PUSH 22 SIDE WAGER.

The purpose of Rule 23 is to establish playing rules for craps and procedures for conducting craps games in compliance with section 44-30-302 (2). The statutory basis for Rule 23 is found in sections 44-30-201, C.R.S., 44-30-203, C.R.S., 44-30-302, C.R.S., and 44-30-818, C.R.S.

RULE 23 RULES FOR CRAPS

30-2399.08 THE PLAY - LUCKY ROLLER.

LUCKY ROLLER IS A CRAPS VARIATION GAME, THE RIGHTS TO WHICH ARE OWNED BY INTERBLOCK U.S.A. L.C., LAS VEGAS, NEVADA AND WHICH MAY BE TRANSFERRED OR ASSIGNED.

CRAPS WITH LUCKY ROLLER MUST BE PLAYED ACCORDING TO THE FOLLOWING RULES:

(1) <u>Lucky Roller may be played only on tables displaying Lucky Roller layout on the user</u> Interface.

- (2) <u>LUCKY ROLLER IS AN OPTIONAL WAGER FOR CRAPS AND INCLUDES THREE ADDITIONAL WAGERS, LOW ROLLS, HIGH ROLLS, AND ROLL 'EM ALL. WAGERS ARE INDEPENDENT AND HAVE NO EFFECT ON THE PRIMARY GAME OF CRAPS OR OTHER PLACED WAGERS.</u>
- PLAYERS MAY PLACE AN OPTIONAL WAGER ON ONE, TWO, OR THREE LUCKY ROLLER WAGERS. ALL THREE LUCKY ROLLER OPTIONAL WAGERS CAN ONLY BE PLACED PRIOR TO THE COME OUT ROLL AND ONLY WHEN THE PREVIOUS ROLL WAS A SEVEN (7).
- (4) TO PARTICIPATE IN THE LUCKY ROLLER OPTIONAL WAGER, A PLAYER MUST PLACE THE CHIPS TO ONE OF THE DESIGNATED LUCKY ROLLER BETTING FIELDS ON THEIR USER INTERFACE. AFTER THE COME OUT ROLL, IF THE TOTAL WAS NOT 7, THE CHIPS PLACED ON THE LUCKY ROLLER OPTIONAL WAGER WILL RECEIVE A PADLOCK, THAT WILL REMAIN UNTIL A WAGER HAS WON OR A 7 WAS ROLLED.
- (5) FOR ANY DICE THROW, WHERE THE TOTAL IS ANYTHING BUT A SEVEN (7), THE NUMBER FOR THE TOTAL ON THE LUCKY ROLLER OPTIONAL WAGER WILL BECOME HIGHLIGHTED, INDICATING THE PROGRESS OF THE WAGER. THE NUMBER IN THE CIRCLE WILL CHANGE COLOR FROM WHITE TO BLACK, AND THE CIRCLE BACKGROUND WILL CHANGE THE COLOR FROM THE MAIN USER INTERFACE BACKGROUND COLOR TO YELLOW. FOR EXAMPLE, IF THE SHOOTER ROLLS A TOTAL OF TEN (10), THE CIRCLE WITH THE NUMBER TEN WILL BECOME HIGHLIGHTED.

THE WAGER WINS, WHEN ALL THE TOTALS FOR THE COMBINATION ARE ROLLED, BEFORE A SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED.

(6) IF ANY TOTAL IS REROLLED, IT HAS NO EFFECT ON THE WAGER. WHEN A TOTAL OF SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED, ALL LUCKY ROLLER BETS LOSE, CHIPS ARE REMOVED FROM THE LUCKY ROLLER BETTING FIELD AND CIRCLES WITH NUMBERS, INDICATING THE WAGER PROGRESS, CHANGE BACK TO THEIR INITIAL STATE.

LOW ROLLS

THIS WAGER COMBINATION INCLUDES ALL THE "LOW" TOTALS – 2, 3, 4, 5 AND 6. ALL OF THESE TOTALS MUST BE ROLLED BEFORE A SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED. PLAYERS MAY ONLY MAKE THIS WAGER ON THE COME OUT ROLL AND ONLY WHEN THE PREVIOUS ROLL WAS A SEVEN (7). THE BET LOSES WHENEVER A SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED, INCLUDING A SEVEN (7) ON THE COME OUT ROLL. IF ALL OF THE "LOW" TOTALS ARE ROLLED, THE WAGER WILL PAY ACCORDING TO THE ENABLED PAY TABLE (300, 301 OR 302), WHICH IS DISPLAYED ON THE LUCKY ROLLER WAGERING FIELD. THE CHIPS WILL BE REMOVED. ALL THE NUMBERS FROM THE COMBINATION WILL STAY HIGHLIGHTED, UNTIL A SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED, AND NEW LUCKY ROLLER WAGERS CAN BE PLACED.

HIGH ROLLS

This wager combination includes all the "High" totals – 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12. All of these totals must be rolled before a seven (7) is rolled. Players may only make this wager on the come out roll and only when the previous roll was a seven (7). The bet loses whenever a seven (7) is rolled, including a seven (7) on the come out roll. If all of the "High" totals are rolled, the wager will pay according to the enabled pay table (300, 301 or 302), which is displayed on the Lucky Roller wagering field. The chips will be removed. All the numbers from the combination will stay highlighted, until a seven (7) is rolled, and new Lucky Roller wagers may be placed.

ROLL 'EM ALL

THIS WAGER COMBINATION INCLUDES ALL THE TOTALS – 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11 AND 12, EXCEPT SEVEN (7). ALL OF THESE TOTALS MUST BE ROLLED BEFORE A SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED. PLAYERS MAY ONLY MAKE THIS WAGER ON THE COME OUT ROLL AND ONLY WHEN THE PREVIOUS ROLL WAS A SEVEN (7). THE BET LOSES WHENEVER A SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED, INCLUDING A SEVEN (7) ON THE COME OUT ROLL. IF ALL THE TOTALS ARE ROLLED, THE WAGER WILL PAY ACCORDING TO THE ENABLED PAY TABLE (300, 301 OR 302), WHICH IS DISPLAYED ON THE LUCKY ROLLER

WAGERING FIELD. THE CHIPS WILL BE REMOVED. ONLY AFTER A SEVEN (7) IS ROLLED, THE NUMBERS WILL CHANGE BACK TO THEIR ORIGINAL STATE, AND NEW LUCKY ROLLER WAGERS MAY BE PLACED.

Re: Steven Min, Request for Addition to the Involuntary Exclusion List

On October 16, 2025, I will be requesting the Colorado Limited Gaming Control Commission to add Steven Min to the Involuntary Exclusion List in accordance with Gaming Regulations 30-2907, 1 C.C.R. 207-1. I am submitting this memorandum for your consideration in support of that request.

On October 16, 2014, while playing roulette in the Lady Luck Casino in Black Hawk, Mr. Min had a disagreement with the pit supervisor. Mr Min had placed a \$100 wager on position #1 to #18, and stepped away from the table. That wager pays 1 to 1. When the ball dropped on #13, he thought he won. The Pit Supervisor said Mr. Min did not win because he was not present at the table. Mr. Min became upset and knocked over all the chips on the roulette table, then grabbed several of the chips, sticking them in his pockets. A Division Investigator responded and reviewed the incident. It was determined Mr. Min did win \$100. Mr. Min was paid his winnings and the chips he took were recovered. Casino staff asked Mr. Min to leave the casino and told him he was barred entry for seven days. After an investigation by the Division, Mr. Min was charged with Fraudulent Acts in violation of section 12-47.1-823(1)(c), C.R.S. [now section 44-30-822(1)(c)] and Disorderly Conduct in violation of section 18-9-106(1)(a), C.R.S. The case was filed with Gilpin County Courts under case number 2014M0499. The Division documented its investigation in case DOG14004088. The criminal case is still open and there is an active warrant for Min's arrest.

On October 17, 2014, Mr. Min was playing roulette at the Golden Gates Casino in Black Hawk. He became verbally abusive towards a dealer and pit supervisor after they made a decision not in his favor. Following a review of the incident, it was determined Mr. Min was correct and was underpaid \$35. Mr. Min was then paid the correct amount. There were no criminal charges filed in this case. This is documented in the Division's case DOG14004101.

On October 19, 2014, Mr. Min was at the Mardi Gras Casino in Black Hawk playing blackjack. He was asked to leave the casino after becoming verbally abusive towards staff when he thought he was paid incorrectly. After an investigation by the Division, it was determined Mr. Min was paid correctly. There were no criminal charges filed in this case. The Division documented its investigation in case DOG14004121.

On March 8, 2022, Division Investigators responded to the Century Casino in Cripple Creek when accounting and surveillance found a \$1,800 overpayment. After an investigation, it was determined the overpayment was done on March 4, 2022 and went to Mr. Min. The investigation showed Mr. Min had won three jackpots on electronic roulette, one of which was \$1,800. After Mr. Min was paid, the slot attendant made a mistake of not clearing the \$1,800 jackpot off the machine to show it had been paid. A short time later, Mr. Min was playing on an adjacent terminal. When another slot attendant walked by, Mr. Min motioned towards the machine which still showed a jackpot owed. The slot attendant paid Mr. Min the \$1,800 additional jackpot. At that time, Mr. Min left the casino. The case was filled with Teller County Courts (case number 2023CR04) for Fraudulent Acts under section 44-30-822(1)(c), C.R.S., which states in part: [i]t is unlawful for a person "to claim, collect, or take, or attempt to claim, collect or take money or anything of value in or from a limited gaming activity with intent to defraud and without having made a wager contingent thereon or take an amount greater than the amount won." Under section 44-30-822(2), C.R.S., repeat offenders can be charged with a class 5 felony. The Division documented the investigation in case DOG22000876. There is still an active felony warrant for Mr. Min in this case.

On December 10, 2024, Mr. Min was at the Monarch Casino in Black Hawk. Black Hawk Police Officers were dispatched there because staff recognized him as previously being trespassed. According to casino reports, Mr. Min had been trespassed four times since 2018. Officers subsequently charged Mr. Min in Gilpin County Court with trespass under section 18-4-504(1), C.R.S. (case number 2024M400). The Black Hawk Police Department documented its investigation in case 2402135. The criminal case is still pending and there is still an active warrant for Mr. Min in this case.

On December 13, 2024, Division Investigators were dispatched to the Chamonix Casino in Cripple Creek in reference to a disturbance. When they arrived, they learned Mr. Min had been verbally abusive towards employees and the casino was going to trespass him. Investigators stayed on scene until Mr. Min left the casino. The Division documented its investigation in case DOG24005001. Mr. Min was not charged in this case.

During this investigation, it was determined that Mr. Min has been excluded from casinos in multiple states.

Mr. Min is excluded from all casinos in Pennsylvania, effective on August 18, 2011. He petitioned to be removed from the exclusion list on August 24, 2016, but it was denied by the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board on March 24, 2017. One of the reasons for the denial was his violation of the exclusion order on at least nine occasions. This is documented in Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board's Order No. 1992-2011.

Mr. Min is excluded from all casinos in Maine since May 24, 2017, due to being identified as an advantage player and also the exclusions in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Mr. Min is excluded from all casinos in New Jersey since 2011 as a result of being arrested and convicted of criminal trespass 11 times between 2006 and 2010, all of which occurred in licensed casinos in Atlantic City, New Jersey.

Mr. Min was convicted on August 11, 2006 of swindling and cheating at a New Jersey casino, in violation of N.J.S.A. 5:12-113a. Mr. Min was cheating at blackjack. This is documented in Atlantic City, New Jersey Police Department case number ATL05002035-001.

Mr. Min was also convicted on that same date of swindling and cheating at a New Jersey casino, documented in Atlantic City Police Department case number ATL05004366-001. Mr. Min was also cheating at blackjack. Both convictions were fourth degree convictions in New Jersey (the convictions would have been class 1 misdemeanor convictions in Colorado at the time).

Mr. Min is excluded from all casinos in Michigan. The reason for this exclusion is because of criminal convictions in Connecticut, New Jersey, Nevada, Pennsylvania, and New York; and exclusions in New Jersey, Delaware, Pennsylvania and Missouri, according to the Michigan Gaming Control Board.

Based on Division's investigations into Mr. Min's conduct as briefly described above and in greater detail in its investigation's files, the Division asserts:

Mr. Min's presence poses a threat to the interest of the State or licensed gaming, including members of the public under Regulation 30-2907(2)(c)(i); and

Mr. Min's reputation would adversely affect public confidence and trust that the gaming industry is free from criminal or corruptive influences under Regulation 30-2907(2)(c)(iv).


Mr. Min has prior exclusions and ejections from gaming establishments under the laws or gaming rules of any other state, the United States or any of its possessions or territories, or an Indian tribe, including Maine, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Michigan under Regulation 30-2907(2)(c)(v); and

Mr. Min is a career / professional offender of gaming laws throughout the country under Regulation 30-2907(2)(c)(vi), specifically his actions in Colorado in 2014 and 2022, and New Jersey in 2005.

Steven Min's previous conduct also threatens the integrity of limited gaming in Colorado and the public's confidence and trust that licensed limited gaming is conducted honestly and competitively.

If the Commission approves the Division of Gaming's request that Steven Min be placed on the Involuntary Exclusion list in accordance with Gaming Regulation 30-2907, 1 C.C.R. 207-1, the Division requests that he be placed on the list within 35 days after the Commission issues/serves its written order.

Per the listed criteria in Gaming Regulation 30-2907, 1 C.C.R. 207-1, and for purposes of identification, Steven Min's date of birth is 12/27/1974. He is also known as Song Min, Steven Hyon, Steven H Min, Steven S Min, Sung Min, Chris Wang, Steven Hyonmin and Steven Sung Min. He is described as an Asian male, 5 feet 5 inches, 125 lbs, with black hair, and brown eyes. His last known address is , New Jersey 08003. Mr Min's photo appears below.

Involuntary Exclusion Request for Preston Ivan Allred

Re: Preston Ivan Allred, Request for Addition to Involuntary Exclusion List

On October 16, 2025, I will be requesting the Colorado Limited Gaming Control Commission add Preston Ivan Allred to the Involuntary Exclusion List in accordance with the Gaming Regulations 30-2907, 1 C.C.R. 207-1. I am submitting this memorandum for your consideration in support of that request.

On September 1, 2025, at approximately 3:02 AM, Division of Gaming Investigator Robb Shimp responded to the Monarch Casino in Black Hawk regarding a banned patron later identified as Preston Ivan Allred. Mr. Allred was initially thought to be an unwanted guest, due to the fact he was playing with another patron's player's card. Investigator Shimp contacted Gilpin County Communications and confirmed Mr. Allred had a limited extradition arrest warrant for Failure to Comply issued by Jefferson County (case number 2024M6934) and a statewide extradition arrest warrant for Domestic Violence issued by Douglas County (case number 2023M2895).

When Investigator Shimp advised Mr. Allred that he was under arrest, Mr. Allred made a sudden forward movement, striking Investigator Shimp and forcing both to the ground. Mr. Allred broke free of Investigator Shimp's grasp, at which time Monarch Casino Security Supervisor Andrew Dreier attempted to restrain him. Mr. Allred again broke free and fled towards the second-floor parking garage.

At approximately 3:12 AM, Mr. Allred exited the parking garage and ran southbound on Main Street, where he hid behind a white SUV in a nearby open parking lot. At 3:13 AM, Black Hawk Police Department officers arrived, located Mr. Allred, and with weapons drawn, ordered him to surrender. At 3:14 AM, officers placed Mr. Allred into custody. At 3:16 AM, emergency medical personnel were dispatched to aid Investigator Shimp, who sustained injuries during the assault. Investigator Shimp was transported to Lutheran Medical Center for evaluation and released after being treated for minor injuries and an elevated heart rate.

Mr. Allred was subsequently charged with the following offenses in Gilpin County District Court (case number 2025CR00095), all filed on September 1, 2025:

section 18-8-104(1)(a), C.R.S. – Obstructing a Peace Officer/Firefighter/EMT, a class 2 misdemeanor); section 18-8-204(2)(a), C.R.S. – Introducing Contraband in the 2nd Degree, a class 6 felony; section 18-8-103, C.R.S. – Resisting Arrest, a class 2 misdemeanor, section

18-3-203(1)(c) – 2nd Degree Assault on a Peace Officer, a class 4 felony; and section. 18-3-203(1)(c.5) – 2nd Degree Assault on a Peace Officer/Intent - Serious Bodily Harm, a class 4 felony.

In addition to the new charges, Mr. Allred also had the following active Fugitive of Justice (FOJ) warrants at the time of his arrest:

- Failure to Appear Warrant issued by Jefferson County, CO, under 16-19-103, C.R.S. (FOJ / Warrant Arrest), bond set at \$1,000 cash/surety (case number 2024M6934);
- Contempt Warrant issued by Douglas County, CO, under 16-19-103, C.R.S. (FOJ / Warrant Arrest), bond set at \$5,000 cash/surety (case number 2023M2895).

The Division documented its investigation in case DOG25004087. Based on its investigations into Mr. Allred's conduct as briefly described above and in greater detail in its investigations file, the Division asserts:

- Mr. Allred's presence poses a threat to the interest of the State or licensed gaming, including members of the public under Regulation 30-2907(2)(c)(i), 1 C.C.R. 207-1.
- Mr. Allred's reputation would adversely affect public confidence and trust that the gaming industry is free from criminal or corruptive influences under Regulation 30-2907(2)(c)(iv).

I was unable to locate any information showing Mr. Allred has been placed on any exclusion list or ejected from any other casinos in any other jurisdiction.

The Division requests that the Colorado Limited Gaming Control Commission add Preston Ivan Allred to the Involuntary Exclusion List permanently in accordance with the Gaming Regulations 30-2907.

If the Commission approves the Division of Gaming's request that Preston Ivan Allred be placed on the Involuntary Exclusion List permanently in accordance with Gaming Regulation 30-2907, 1 C.C.R. 207-1, the Division requests that he be placed on the list within thirty-five (35) days after the Commission issues/serves a written order.

Per the listed criteria in Gaming Regulation 30-2907, 1 C.C.R. 207-1, and for purposes of identification, Preston Ivan Allred's date of birth is 09/29/1992. He is described as a Caucasian male, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 190 pounds, with brown hair and brown eyes. His last known address is Parker, CO 80134. Mr. Allred's booking photo appears below.




Management of State Hotline (1-800 GAMBLER)

- 1-800-GAMBLER Hotline Management: PGCC coordinated hotline updates and referrals in collaboration with the Louisiana Association on Compulsive Gambling (LACG).
 - 6,916 total contacts handled via calls, texts, and chats.
- Key Highlights:
 - 70% of hotline callers reported financial problems as a primary issue.
 - Majority of hotline users were male (78%) and aged 25–34 years.
 - 54% of callers identified as Caucasian, with Hispanic individuals comprising 12%.



Moving Research into Action

The mission of KRI is to provide state gaming regulators, legislatures, and public health experts with world-class research that will help reduce health inequities for those experiencing gambling disorder in the populations they serve, improve overall health of their citizens, and inform public health policy and gambling legislation.

At KRI, we believe that telehealth integration into existing treatment options as well as stand alone telehealth systems that compliment the care delivery continuum are the key to access for the future of treatment for individuals, families, and sub-populations that are at higher risk of experiencing gambling related harms due to age, socio-economic status, location in a rural community, race, ethnicity, religion, or gender identity.

Our goal is to advance the adoption of evidence-based telehealth solutions for gambling and gaming communities. Through research, we are currently developing evidence-based practice models for gambling with the intent of better understanding how telehealth, better access to assistance, and better access to the right tools, can impact high-quality mental health outcomes for those in treatment.



Colorado Military Problem Gambling Research, Education, & Recovery Program Phase 2

- Understanding and Managing Gambling Disorder with a special focus on veterans and suicide clinician's module was created. This is a 3-hour module worth 3 CEU/CME's and is available for free to all in Colorado
- A Colorado Vets digital resource hub was created and distributed through multiple channels including learning management systems, university veteran centres, and direct partnerships with bases around Colorado
- The Veterans Recovery Program was expanded with virtual peer support groups and enhanced telehealth treatment options, ensuring broader access for veterans and their families





Colorado Military Problem Gambling Research, Education, & Recovery Program Phase 2

- The Colorado Military Research Fellowship (CMRF) grew in participation and impact, with fellows conducting novel public health research and community-focused initiatives
- The ROTC education program was updated with new content on fantasy and digital gambling products, representing a substantial step forward in addressing emerging forms of gambling risk
- During Problem Gambling Awareness Month, we partnered with Joining Community Forces (JCF) to distribute information products around the topics of gambling, financial readiness, the intersectional of suicide and gambling, and gambling in the military.






Athlete Well-being Program

- The AWB application has now been distributed across all universities, colleges, and junior colleges in Colorado. Each institution has received waivers as part of their internal legal review process
- To strengthen program offerings, three full days of on-site filming were completed to produce new educational
 content specifically designed for athletes. Feedback from professional sports organizations, mental health
 professionals, and regulators has been universally positive, with many expressing eagerness to access and
 utilize the content
- This educational content focused on mental health and designed to educate athletes about the impact of sports-betting on mental well-being, depression, anxiety, performance pressure, social media harassment, social isolation, and match fixing education.
- Based on direct feedback and reinforced by recent NCAA research, we prioritized outreach to smaller institutions, where gambling-related issues are significantly more prevalent.



Healthy Gaming Education Program

- Four educational videos for parents were produced in collaboration with Dr. Kaufmann and Dr. Diez-Morel, covering topics such as what online safety, bullying, financial aspects of gaming
- Age-appropriate videos were created for children ages 7–11, specifically designed to match their attention span and comprehension levels. These included engaging content on how the mind works, dopamine, balancing gaming with other activities and safety.
- To complement the video series, downloadable resources were also developed to reinforce learning and extend the program's reach.
- A dedicated page was launched on the KRI website, providing free and easy statewide access for families across Colorado





Screening and Telehealth Enhancement for Gambling Disorder (STEGD) Initiative in Colorado

- A 3-hour clinical training module (Managing and Understanding Gambling Disorder was developed and accredited for 3 CEU/CME credits, specifically tailored for Colorado clinicians. The module covers screening tools, practical instruction on their use, and guidance on integrating them into clinical practice
- To ensure wide reach, the training was promoted through targeted social media campaigns and distributed
- directly to therapist offices across the state.
